



Rising Star Temperatureblanket 2021 - Design Ellinor Widéen Frostvirka

Yarn: Yarnpack Catona 17 colours from www.favoritgarner.se I have used 16 colours for the squares and the 17th, white, for the joining.

Hook: 3,0

Size: A blocked square is approximately 13 x 13 cm. A finished blanket will be approximately 117 x 78 cm + edging.

US terms used:

St – stitch

Ch – chain

Chsp – chain space

Sl st – slip stitch

Sc – single crochet

Dc – double crochet

Hdc – half double crochet

Tr – treble crochet

Fpdc – front post double crochet

Fpdc2tog – front post double crochet two together

Fptr2tog - front post treble crochet two together

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This temperatureblanket is made of 54 squares. You start a new square every Monday and you finish it on Sunday. Since a year has 52 weeks you will need to make 2 extra squares to make your blanket rectangular. You can for example make an extra square on a family member's birthday or simply make two squares the first and the last week of the year. I start making my first square on Monday the 4th of January. The blanket will have 9 rows of squares with 6 squares in each row.

Monday (round 1): Make a chain ring, ch 4, sl st in initial ch 1. Ch 3 (acts as first dc), 11 dc in the ring, sl st in initial dc. **12 dc**

Tuesday (round 2): (dc + ch 2 + dc in dc, ch 1, 2 dc in each of the following 2 dc, ch 1) x 4, sl st in initial dc. **24 dc, 4 ch2sp and 8 ch1sp**



Wednesday (round 3): (dc + ch 2 + dc in ch2sp, 2 dc in the back loop on dc, skip ch1sp, 1 fpdc around each of the following 4 dc, skip ch1sp, 2 dc in the back loop on dc) x 4, sl st in initial dc. **16 fpdc, 24 dc and 4 chsp.**



Thursday (round 4): (dc + ch + dc in ch2sp, 2 dc in the back loop on dc, 1 dc in the back loop on each of the following 2 dc, 1 fpdc around each of the following 4 fpdc, 1 dc in the back loop on each of the following 2 dc, 2 dc in the back loop on dc) x 4, sl st in initial dc. **16 fpdc, 40 dc and 4 chsp.**



Friday (round 5): (dc + ch 2 + dc in ch2sp, 1 dc in the back loop on each of the following 5 dc, fptr2tog around 2 fpdc, fptr2tog around 2 fpdc, 1 dc in the back loop on each of the following 5 dc) x 4, sl st in initial dc. **8 fptr2tog, 48 dc and 4 chsp.**



Saturday (round 6): (tr + ch 2 + tr in ch2sp, skip dc, 2 dc in the same st, skip dc, 2 dc in the same st, skip dc, 2 hdc in the same st, fpdc2tog around 2 fptr2tog, 2 hdc in the same st, skip dc, 2 dc in the same st, skip dc, 2 dc in the same st, skip dc) x 4, sl st in initial tr. **4 fpdc2tog, 8 tr, 32 dc, 16 hdc and 4 chsp.**



Sunday (round 7): (dc + ch 2 + dc in ch2sp, 1 dc in the back loop of each of the following 7 st, 1 fpdc around fpdc2tog, 1 dc in the back loop of each of the following 7 st) x 4, sl st in initial dc. **4 fpdc, 64 dc and 4 chsp.**



Block your square if needed to make it flat.

Joining round

Colour white (106)

***2 sc + ch 3 + 2 sc** in chsp, ch 1 (skip dc, 2 sc in the same st, ch 1) x 8, repeat from*around, sl st in initial sc.

On your very first square you make the complete round. For the following squares, you join each square when it is finished to the previous square. Each row consists of 6 squares. When you have finished your first row, continue to join your new square to your previous row.

The joining starts in a corner after 2 sc in chsp.

Ch 1, take out the hook from the loop, put the hook from above in chsp in the corner on your previous square, pull yarn through chsp, ch 1, back to you present square, 2 sc in chsp,



(take out the hook from the loop, put the hook from above in ch1sp on your previous square 3, pull yarn through chsp, back to your present square, skip st, 2 sc in the same st) x 8,



take out the hook from the loop, put the hook from above in ch1sp on your previous square, pull yarn through chsp, back to your present square, skip st, 2 sc in ch2sp, ch 1, take out the hook from the loop, put the hook from above in ch3sp in the corner on your previous square, pull yarn through chsp, ch 1, back to you present square, 2 sc in ch2sp. You have now joined the squares on one side.



When you have finished your first row of squares and joined the 7th square, you will join each square on two sides. More information and photos of this will come after week 7.
